Omni Hotel readies for January grand opening

Construction crews working on the \$241 million Omni Hotel in downtown Oklahoma City have completed the building's structural framework, and the finishing touches are all that remain for the 17-story, 605-room hotel.

"People are going to be thrilled when we open our doors," said Dan Boyer, Director of Sales and Marketing. "It's a beautiful hotel and will be unlike anything else in town. It's something the people of OKC are going to be proud of and will want their family and friends to experience."

The project began in October 2018 and remains on schedule for a late January 2021 opening. The hotel is located adjacent to the Oklahoma City Convention Center and Scissortail Park.

The state-of-the-art hotel was a collaboration between hospitality veterans, including Rule Joy Trammell + Rubio (architect), Brasfield & Gorrie (general contractor) and Bill Rooney Studio (interior design). The hotel will offer seven

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Leadership Notes

In some ways, it's one of those truisms that we almost take for granted in Oklahoma City: "Working together, we can get great things accomplished."

But, as many other communities can currently attest, effectively collaborating to solve big problems is not something that should be presumed as automatic. It doesn't always happen, and when it does, it's generally precipitated by less-than-ideal conditions, inherent distrust and conflicting goals among parties. Thankfully, in OKC, collaboration and partnership in response to challenges is almost de rigueur. Sometimes it's even referred to as our "secret sauce," the special thing that we have at our disposal that others don't, but wish they did.

An example is the state's recent ascension up the ranks of highway bridge conditions. In 2004, we were ranked 49th in the number of structurally deficient bridges. It took a long-term sustained effort by legislators responding to the concerns of their constituents, forward-thinking agencies like ODOT, and advocacy endeavors like ours and others from the business community to bring us to our present top-ten ranking in this area. It's testimony to what an engaged, aligned business community like ours can do when we work together. Like our work on criminal justice reform and numerous other examples, it takes all of us pulling on the same rope to make headway into complex difficulties: it takes time, it takes commitment, it takes resources, it takes creativity and diversity of ideas, but together, we can make great things happen for our city.

From our city's very founding, a business community with a commitment to partnership has proven its worth. For many, if not most, these are difficult times with their own special set of difficulties. We know we have tough challenges ahead and big problems to puzzle out, but we also know if we work together, we can tackle anything that comes our way. And that's perhaps the best part of the spirit of Oklahoma City—and one that we should be loath to lose.

unique dining outlets, an expansive pool deck with event space, retail, indoor and outdoor meeting space, and a full-service spa with eight treatment rooms.

“We are nearing the completion of construction. Guest rooms are finished through to the 14th floor,” Boyer said. “Much of the carpet and tile throughout the hotel has been laid. What remains are the main entrance, sidewalks, landscaping, final detailing and to place furniture throughout the hotel.

“The hotel will open with between 250 and 270 total associates. We originally planned for approximately 400 employees, but with the COVID-19 pandemic we’ve reduced that by half,” Boyer said. “We anticipate our staffing levels to increase as business volumes pick up. We feel very good about the talent level in the area.”

The first planned event at the Omni Hotel is the local annual United Way Gala in early February.

OTHER DETAILS

Omni Oklahoma City Hotel will be a true lifestyle hotel, reflective of its natural surroundings and the unique local culture of Oklahoma:

- **Design:** Taking cues from Oklahoma’s dramatic prairie landscapes, design characteristics include a sky-blue color palette, abstract natural grass patterns in corridors and chevron patterns inspired by the Scissortail bird. Select guest rooms were designed with professional basketball teams in-mind and feature larger door frames, taller ceilings and shower heads and California King beds.
- **Amenities:** Complementing the local area’s many attractions and activities, Omni Oklahoma City Hotel will be home to a Mokara Spa, featuring eight treatment rooms and offering wellness experiences and salon services. The hotel will have a retail shop featuring rare finds from local vendors, a two-level sports/entertainment bar, and a rooftop pool with a bar and grill located on the 3rd level with stunning views of Scissortail Park and city skyline.



Omni Hotell will feature seven unique dining outlets, an expansive pool deck with event space, retail, indoor and outdoor meeting space, and a full-service spa.

- **Culinary:** The Omni Hotel will offer seven unique culinary outlets, with several restaurants lining Robinson Avenue with outdoor patio seating and street entrances. Dining experiences will include a Bob’s Steak & Chop House, lobby bar, sports bar, all-day dining, coffee shop, walk-up burger bar and a poolside bar and grill.
- **Meetings:** Located between the new convention center and Chesapeake Energy Arena, the Omni Hotel will be a nationwide destination for meetings and events. All 78,000 square feet of function space will be on the second floor, except for an outdoor event lawn on the third level.

“Oklahoma City has been incredibly welcoming to our Omni family. The revitalization surrounding this hotel is unprecedented, and we are honored to be a partner in the its future” said Peter Streb, president of Omni Hotels & Resorts. “We are redefining and re-imagining the traditional headquarters hotel in exciting markets of growth and change across the country, and Oklahoma City is leading the way for progressive downtown redevelopment.”

Omni Oklahoma City Hotel will become a part of Omni’s robust, and growing Convention Center Collection, which features signature properties in Atlanta, Louisville, Dallas, Nashville and Boston.

OKC Marathon using virtual format for 20th race

Oklahoma City hosts the 20th Anniversary of the Oklahoma City Memorial Marathon as a virtual race and tribute to those who killed in Murrah Building bombing, those who survived and those changed forever.

The marathon also supports the privately owned and operated Oklahoma City National Memorial & Museum.

Health and safety of race participants is of the utmost importance to the OKC Memorial Marathon team, and out of an abundance of caution, this year’s race has transitioned to a virtual run. Participants can run the race any time between Oct. 4-18, 2020. For the first time this year, cyclists will take part in the virtual format.

The Oklahoma City Memorial Marathon is partnering with Tulsa’s Williams Route 66 Marathon this year. Anyone who participates in the virtual Oklahoma City Memorial Marathon or half marathon from Oct. 4-18 and the virtual Williams Route 66 Marathon



or half marathon in November will receive a special commemorative Oklahoma Standard medal in addition to their individual race medals.

Since its inception in 2001, the race has grown continuously and attracted some elite runners in the world. Over time, the Oklahoma City Memorial Marathon has grown into one of the best races in the country, while its emotional and inspirational power — as we reflect on what we can learn from the tragedy of April 19, 1995 — has never waned.

Whether this will be your first marathon or you are a top athlete, it will be a Run to Remember.

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
Chamber, Urban League Launch Inclusion Series to create stronger dialogue, engagement


Prairie Surf Media to transform Cox Convention Center into motion picture, television studio

Oklahoma City is moving forward with its plans to turn Cox Convention Center into a motion picture and television studio. Oklahoma City-based Prairie Surf Media (PSM) was granted the rights to establish Prairie Surf Studios in the CCC which will house the largest clear-span soundstages in the Midwest.

Under the direction of entertainment industry veterans Rachel Cannon and Matt Payne, PSM will encompass over 260,000 square feet of production space including 140,000 square feet dedicated to five clear-span soundstages, ranging from 25,000 to 32,000 square feet each. The production facility will also offer attached hotels, a diner with a separate kitchen, a commercial-grade kitchen and an underground tunnel system.

Cannon and Payne, who have both spent decades working in the entertainment business, saw an opportunity in their home state to help elevate the industry by providing infrastructure.

“We are passionate about empowering storytellers while creating jobs that will truly create economic diversity for Oklahoma. The entertainment industry is not just actors and directors. Each production will have high-paying jobs that range from construction workers and electricians to accountants and tech. With unemployment at an all-time high, we want to show Oklahomans how their existing skill sets can pivot into this brand-new industry,” they said.
